



BUILDING BACK BEAUREGARD

Few communities have ever witnessed the devastation from a tornado the way the rural, unincorporated community of Beaugard, Alabama, did on March 3 when a massive EF-4 tornado carved a nearly mile-wide path of destruction — destroying numerous homes and taking the lives of 23 people. The people of Beaugard desperately need our help as they rebuild their lives ... and their homes.

The Fuller Center for Housing is bringing its **Millard Fuller Legacy Build** to Beaugard for a weeklong blitz, Sept. 29-Oct. 4, 2019, during which hundreds of volunteers from the area and from across the U.S. will build 11 homes. This is in addition to three Fuller Center homes already dedicated after a weeklong blitz in May and two more built in July.

The Legacy Build is as much about restoring hope as it is about helping families have decent places to live. Our efforts in Beaugard already have received tremendous support from the community and building partners, as well as a great deal of publicity from television and newspapers. We expect the blitz to attract even more interest, publicity and community involvement.
